## SUPERIOR COURT OF CALIFORNIA, COUNTY OF CONTRA COSTA Application for Discharge from Accountability Government Code section 25259.7

The Court Collections Unit (CCU) of the Superior Court of California, County of Contra Costa (Court) respectfully applies to the Presiding Judge of the Court for a discharge from accountability for the court-ordered debt listed in Attachment A, that it would otherwise be responsible for collecting. Attachment A contains a list of 1,262 criminal, juvenile delinquency, and traffic offenses that occurred in or before the year 2000, with a total balance due of \$323,692.90. These balances do not include any victim's restitution owed.

The Judicial Council provided guidance indicating that collections programs do not appear to have the authority to enforce criminal judgments entered on or before October 19, 2000 using the methods authorized under the Enforcement of Judgments Law (CCP 680.010 et seq.). Since limited enforcement methods are now available to continue to collect on these balances, CCU has determined that all reasonable collection efforts have been taken and the likelihood of collection does not warrant the expense involved.

A discharge from accountability does not constitute a release of any person from liability for payment of any amount owed.

Total amount requested to be discharged from accountability: \$323,692.90

The names of the persons liable and the amount owed by each are incorporated in the attached report.
