**Jennifer Logue Appointed as Contra Costa Superior Court Judge**

The Contra Costa Superior Court is pleased to announce that Governor Gavin Newsom has appointed Jennifer Logue as Judge of the Superior Court. She will take her oath on July 10, 2026, and will preside in Department 39. She fills the vacancy created by the retirement of Judge Edward G. Weil.

Prior to her appointment, Judge Logue served for nearly two decades in local city attorney's offices, culminating with her position as Supervising Attorney for the City of Oakland and, most recently, as City Attorney for the City of Mountain View. In these roles, she advised elected officials, executive leadership, and City departments on a broad range of legal matters involving land use, housing, environmental and employment law, municipal finance, civil rights, elections, and other issues affecting municipal governance. Before assuming these leadership roles, she spent more than 13 years litigating increasingly complex civil matters in state and federal courts. She also served as a Staff Attorney and Senior Motions Attorney for the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit.

Mentorship and community service have been hallmarks of Judge Logue's career. As a City Attorney, Judge Logue oversaw attorneys, code officers, and support staff, establishing performance standards and regularly providing constructive feedback and ongoing training on open meetings, conflict of interest, and transparency laws. As a community volunteer, she has served in several leadership positions for local schools and as a mock trial coach for the Khan Lab School.

Judge Logue graduated from the Georgetown University Law Center and received her Bachelor of Arts in Psychology from Whittier College. Judge Logue is a Bay Area native, and she and her family have been active members of the Contra Costa County community for nearly two decades.
